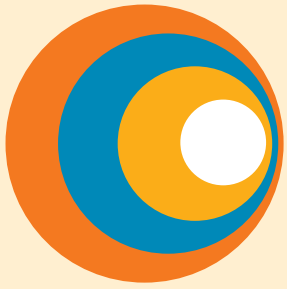

Job overview

The Class Lead is the first formal leadership role within services, forming part of the middle leadership team, and is accountable for learner outcomes within an allocated class.

The role is based within the classroom and leads the day-to-day running of the class, line managing the class team to ensure consistent, safe, and high-quality delivery. The Class Lead ensures that educational, behaviour analytic, and therapeutic programmes are implemented with fidelity, and that barriers to progress are identified and escalated promptly.

What we can offer you

About the role

Key accountabilities

- Accountable for learner outcomes within the class through effective leadership, consistent delivery, and timely escalation.
- Accountable for safeguarding culture, health and safety compliance, and safe practice within the class. They will be the Designated Safeguarding Person of their class, monitoring and recording attendance for their class.
- Accountable for quality assurance at class level, including addressing curriculum outcomes, monitoring progress, assessments and maintaining an accurate evidence trail.
- Accountable for creating and sustaining a transdisciplinary working environment in which all disciplines work collaboratively in the best interests of learners.
- Accountable for the day-to-day delivery and fidelity of all agreed programmes, including education, behaviour support and therapy.
- Accountable for operational leadership, organisation and coordination of the class team and teaching week.
- Accountable for formal line management (direct or through delegation within team) of TLPs, Teacher/Trainee Teacher, Behaviour Analyst/Trainee Behaviour Analyst, Therapists and Therapy Assistants allocated to the class.

Main Responsibilities

Delivery / practice

- Lead daily routines, staff deployment, and expectations so that all staff understand their roles and priorities.
- Ensure that all agreed programmes are delivered consistently and with fidelity across the teaching week.
- Maintain an effective classroom environment, including the organisation of resources, equipment, and learning spaces.
- Support learners to access the full curriculum and wider school activities, including transitions and new learner integration where required.

Outcomes / planning

- Coordinate the class week plan and ensure that teaching, behaviour analytic, and therapeutic priorities are reflected in day-to-day delivery.
- Monitor learner progress, respond to barriers or lack of progress, and ensure plans are updated following professional direction.
- Oversee baseline assessments, Individual Education Plans, annual goals, and related reporting processes to ensure they are accurate, timely, and joined up.
- Lead or coordinate statutory and internal review processes relevant to the class, including annual reviews and end-of-term reporting.



About the role

Collaboration / transdisciplinary working

- Ensure that teaching, behaviour analysis, and therapy input is embedded in daily practice and that responses to learner need are joined up.
- Lead or coordinate transdisciplinary meetings to review progress, discuss barriers, and agree next steps.
- Build and maintain effective working relationships with parents, carers, and relevant external professionals in support of learner outcomes.
- Maintain professional communication with external agencies where required, including Local Authorities and other professionals involved in learners' education and welfare.

Leadership / supervision

- Conduct 1:1s, probation reviews, appraisals, and day-to-day coaching for staff allocated to the class.
- Address concerns early, provide feedback and support, and escalate capability or disciplinary matters in line with policy.
- Support staff development through modelling, feedback, and coordination of relevant class-based training.
- Promote professional conduct, accountability, and effective working relationships across the class team.

Quality assurance / documentation

- Maintain supervision records and ensure that class documentation, data routines, and reporting expectations are met.
- Ensure that learner records, assessments, and review documentation are accurate, up to date, and completed within required timescales.
- Oversee class-level tracking systems to identify progress, concerns, and actions required.
- Monitor the effective use of class resources and, where relevant, support adherence to agreed budget procedures.

Safeguarding / compliance

- Maintain safeguarding vigilance and ensure risk assessments and safe working practices are followed consistently.
- Act as the designated safeguarding person for the class, including monitoring attendance and ensuring concerns are recorded and escalated appropriately.
- Uphold learner welfare, dignity, safety, and independence at all times.
- Ensure that intimate care, medical care, and other support plans are clearly communicated to staff and followed consistently.



About the role

Training and Development, and Progression criteria

- Mandatory Class Lead induction, including safeguarding, safer working, supervision skills, performance management, leading former peers, and transdisciplinary leadership.
- Leadership development and coaching / mentoring during the first year in role.
- Progression criteria to include sustained learner progress, strong delivery fidelity, effective people management, low unresolved quality issues, positive staff feedback, and a strong compliance record.
- Progression route into wider service or senior leadership opportunities.
- The post-holder will be expected to engage in ongoing professional development and contribute to service improvement within the scope of the role.

The Wider Community

- To be an ambassador for the schools and represent its interests in an official capacity.
- To ensure that the schools promote effective links with the local community.
- To maintain professional communication working collaboratively with Local Authorities, Health authorities, the DfE, Ofsted and any other agencies responsible for learners' and their families' educational and pastoral needs.
- Maintain and develop inclusion opportunities for BeyondAutism School learners.
